
Why Denver homeowners spend more on renovations than anyone else in America







More Americans are choosing to <u>renovate their homes instead of relocating</u>, boosting home improvement spending to \$790 billion annually—a 60% increase from 2019 spending. A new report from Instant Roofer, using data from the U.S. Census American Housing Survey, reveals that Denver is the metropolitan area where homeowners spend the most on renovations.

Denver homeowners spend \$14,200 annually on home improvements, according to the report. "Denver has seen a significant rise in remote work opportunities over the past few years, naturally driving residents to invest more in their homes," said Jacob Petrosky, Instant Roofer founder.

Denver homeowners spend more than four times the national average per household—\$900 compared to \$200—on room conversions.

They also spend money on porches, decks, and new windows and doors, mainly due to the extra stress caused by temperature fluctuations.

Following Denver, homeowners in Washington, D.C., and Seattle spend \$14,000 and \$13,300 annually on home improvements, respectively.

Managing renovation costs
